The Spiegeltent Site is open from 10.00am each day, and you can grab food and drink from our Cafe there.





The British Hit Singles & Albums noted that they were "tartan teen sensations from Edinburgh", and were "the first of many acts heralded as the 'biggest group since the Beatles' and one of the most screamed-at teeny-bopper acts of the 1970s". For a relatively brief but fervent period (nicknamed

"Rollermania"), they were worldwide teen idols.

Rollermania is about to hit Big Burns Supper as the band take us through their iconic pop factory which will include popular hits like Shang-A-Lang, Bye Bye Baby, I only wanna be with you, Keen on Dancing and Saturday Night. 



One of the biggest bands of the 2-Tone movement, The Beat present a wall of sound that transcends time and ska fusion rhythms to ignite a crowd. The 2016 line-up features Ranking Roger and Ranking Junior on vocals with Oscar Harrison on drums, Andy Pearson and Steve Harper on guitars.

The Beat are known the world over for a string of hit singles, including "Mirror in the Bathroom", "Too Nice To Talk To", "Can't Get Used To Losing You", "Hands off She's Mine" and "All Out To Get You". Their songs of peace, love and unity fuse ska, pop, reggae and punk rock and their dynamic live show.

Their first single was an arresting version of Smokey Robinson's "Tears Of A Clown", given a completely new feel, and was backed with their own composition "Ranking Full Stop". The single stormed into the Top 10 in December 1979, and saw the band appear twice on Top Of The Pops.

Eddi Reader MBE is a Scottish singer-songwriter, known both for her work with Fairground Attraction and for an enduring solo career. She is the recipient of three BRIT Awards and has topped both the album and singles charts. In 2003 she showcased the works of Scotland's national poet, Robert Burns.

In the early 1980s, she travelled around Europe with circus and performance artists before moving to London, where she quickly became a sought after session vocalist. She famously harmonised with Annie Lennox touring with the Eurythmics, after her time with successful punk outfit Gang of Four, but it was warmly remembered Fairground Attraction that really brought her to the attention of a much wider audience. The single *Perfect* and album First of a *Million Kisses* both topped the British charts.
